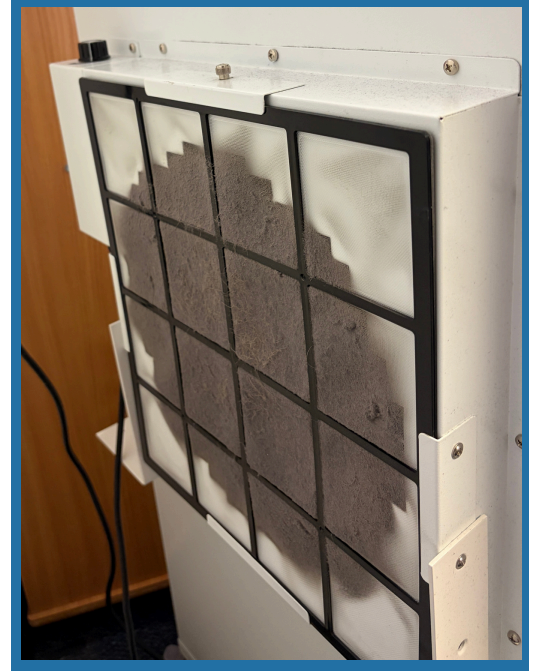


TIME TO CLEAN YOUR AIR FILTER

A clean filter works better, runs quieter, and keeps classroom air fresher.

Dust builds up on the pre-filter at the back means the fan has to work harder - that means more noise, less efficiency, and poorer air quality.

Help protect every breath pupils take



CLEANING FREQUENCY



Part	How often	Why
Pre-filter (rear)	Every 2–4 weeks (or more often in dusty rooms)	Keeps airflow strong and fan noise low
Outer grille & body	Every 1–2 weeks	Maintains hygiene and appearance

Cleaning the pre-filter

1. Turn off and unplug the filter.
2. At the back, unscrew the top bracket and slide out the pre-filter.
3. Vacuum with a HEPA vacuum cleaner.
4. Refit securely before turning back on.

💡 Tip: If you can see a grey layer of dust, it's ready for cleaning.

Cleaning the outer grille and body

1. Always **spray onto a cloth**, not directly onto the unit - especially where the holes are in the front.
2. Wipe gently around all surfaces.
3. **Do not spray** directly on the front grille - moisture can reach and damage the internal HEPA cartridge.

A clean filter means cleaner air for every child
